Common Medications Prescribed	Antihypertensives for hypertension
	ACEi or ARBs for proteinuria
	SGLT2i and GLP1 agonists for proteinuria or CKD
	Aranesp or Procrit for anemia
	Ferrous sulfate or IV iron for iron deficiency anemia
	Midodrine for orthostatic hypotension
	 Vitamin D (ergocalciferol/cholecalciferol) for vitamin D deficiency (loading dose/maintenance)
	Calcitriol for hyperparathyroidism
	Diuretics for edema and kidney stones
	Hypouricemic medications for CKD and kidney stones etc.
