Specialty care of Nephrology conditions include, but are not limited to, the following.

<p>Common Conditions and Diagnoses Treated</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Adrenal Insufficiency • Hematuria (microscopic or macroscopic) • Proteinuria including Nephrotic Syndrome • Kidney Stone Disease • Electrolyte disturbances (e.g. hyponatremia/hypo or hyperkalemia/hypomagnesemia etc.) • Acid base disorders. Metabolic Acidosis or Alkalosis. • Hyperparathyroidism secondary to CKD or Tertiary Hyperparathyroidism (CKD)
<p>Common Medications Prescribed</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Antihypertensives for hypertension • ACEi or ARBs for proteinuria • SGLT2i and GLP1 agonists for proteinuria or CKD • Aranesp or Procrit for anemia • Ferrous sulfate or IV iron for iron deficiency anemia • Midodrine for orthostatic hypotension • Vitamin D (ergocalciferol/cholecalciferol) for vitamin D deficiency (loading dose/maintenance) • Calcitriol for hyperparathyroidism • Diuretics for edema and kidney stones • Hypouricemic medications for CKD and kidney stones etc.
<p>Common Lab Tests and Diagnostic Studies</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Basic Metabolic Panel (BMP) • Complete Blood Count (CBC) • Complement C3 C4 Levels • Iron Panel • Level (PTH) • Microalbumin - Albumin Creatinine Ratio (ACR) • Parathyroid Hormone • Phosphorus Level • Serum Protein Electrophoresis (SPEP) • Uric Acid • Urinalysis (UA) • Urine Immunofixation
